- n. 1. The name of shrines and deities correspond to those most commonly used in the medieval period.
- n. 2. Only the names of typical *honji butsu* (original Buddhist deities) are listed; variants have been omitted.
- n. 3. The number in parentheses of the source column indicates the latest possible century of the shrine's establishment.
- n. 4. In the cases with variant explanations of original Buddhist deities, their names are listed as (1) or (2) and the same number indicate the materials that mention the said deity.
- n. 5. The original Buddhist deity worshipped in the whole sanctuary is separated from individual original Buddhist deities corresponding to *kami* worshipped in each rite with a dotted line.
